


Curriculum

The curriculum at Preston is a unique blend of the Nigerian and British curriculum. While the curriculum structure is in accordance with the 6-3-3-

4 education system which obtains in Nigeria, the curriculum content reflects the British National Curriculum for Secondary Schools, thus providing a much more enriching and enthusing curriculum. This is made possible as a result of careful planning, the methods of delivery and the learning resources put to use.

Subjects offered at JSS level are: English Language, Literature in English, Mathematics, Basic Science,

Business Studies, Social Studies, Christian Religious Studies, Fine Art, Music, Basic Technology, Information and Communication Technology, Agricultural Science, Home Economics, Yoruba, French, Civic Education and Physical and Health Education. The Senior Secondary School, pupils at Preston have the opportunity of sitting the International Cambridge IGCSE Examinations and the Senior School Certificate Exams (SSCE), NECO and UTME in their final year.







Methodology


☐ Superb Facilities



Sports

Pupils at Preston International School have plenty of opportunities in undertaking sporting activities. We believe that sport and fitness are integral to a holistic education, providing lifelong pleasure and fulfillment, relaxation, exercise, self-esteem and team spirit. Inter house sports are held annually.

Music

In terms of self-expression, self-awareness and interpersonal skills, the arts are central to the school's holistic ideals. Music provides the lifeblood for the health and vitality of the whole community. Students learn to play a wide variety of musical instruments. We aim to have one of the best school orchestras in Africa. Prestonians present very challenging choral pieces such as George Frederick Handel's 'Hallelujah Chorus' in four parts, 'And The Glory' etc at special events.













Media Skills

The media is central to in 21st Century life and both parents and teachers often stress 'personality development' as a central issue of a holistic education. Our students are taught to express themselves clearly, knowledgeably, confidently and with conviction in a variety of situations. There is an active and vibrant Press Club with up-to-date technological equipment such as cam-corders, digital cameras and video-editing software being used confidently and competently by members of the club.

Clubs and Activities

There are 13 Clubs in the school. All students are required to belong to at least two clubs - one academic club and one community service club. Sports and Music are compulsory after-school activities for all Prestonians. Parents who would like their children to receive expert professional tuition in musical instruments have to pay an additional charge.

Academic Clubs (9 Clubs) - JETS Club, Literary & Debating, Press, UN Model, Young Farmers, Health & Life. Drama Club. French Club and Home Makers Club. Community Service Clubs (6 Clubs) - Man O' War, Army Cadets, Boys and Girls Brigade, Red Cross, Road Safety and Scouts.

Here, children learn to give of themselves and their resources as patriotic citizens in a highly disciplined and well-structured set up. Programmes are designed around bringing the best out of every child in terms of understanding their civic responsibilities in society.











Design and Technology

Design and Technology - This is currently being offered as part of the Cambridge IGCSE curriculum and has been introduced as a co-curricular activity to augment Introductory Technology at Junior School level. This involves designing and making simple products such as mechanical toys, electronic alarms, and architectural models and can lead eventually to the production of commercially viable products at IGCSE levels. It includes electronics and graphics in addition to such areas as engineering in wood, metal and plastics. It is an excellent introduction to many courses both locally and abroad and is a valued skill by many employers.

Debates & Public Speaking

Prestonians are known for their self-confidence in 25 public speaking and ability to engage in debates. The regular inter-house debate tournaments- which can be described as the "the battle of the elements" as the four houses, Shekinah, Agua, Terra and Tornado debate on a variety of hot topics - are quite electrifying and are opportunities for the development of public speaking. Also, everyday in assembly, Prestonians have the opportunity to make presentations which could be musical, drama or poetry.

Our students regularly compete with other schools both locally and nation-wide in various subjects and they usually win. It is the school's objective to ensure that every child is developed and given opportunities to develop their oratory and public speaking skills.



Campus life at Preston



Boarding life at Preston provides almost endless opportunities for personal development. There is abundant time for study, sports, co-curricular activities, quiet reading and meditation and for simply enjoying the company of classmates. The family atmosphere at Preston provides a secure environment within which strangers rapidly become friends. The house fathers and house mothers liaise closely with other teachers to monitor the quality of the students' prep and other academic work. Most importantly, the house parents carry a major responsibility for the happiness and integration of students and for keeping in close touch with the parents by email or other means. The activities of the house parents are coordinated by the head of boarding.

Dining

The 800-seater dining hall is also the venue for day-to-day dining and for regular formal dinners with a wide range of guest speakers. The Tuck Shop referred to as 'The Rotunda' as a result of its peculiar design - provides snacks and other light refreshments to everyone on campus. All installations are planned to be of international hygienic standard with state of the art hot and cold counters, juice and cold drinks dispensers, dish washers and waste disposal. The individual daily menus include continental and traditional dishes. Meals are carefully planned by expert dieticians and only premium quality water, juice and organically cultivated fruit, vegetables and eggs will be served as these are in abundance from farms within the locality of the school and the suburbs another added advantage for Preston International School.

Safety & Security

Our carefully appointed teachers, house parents and well-equipped security staff are set to work together to ensure that a safe and secure school is ours. The school campus will have CCTV surveillance of all entrances and exits, smoke detectors and a range of security equipment.

Medical Care

The school has a well-equipped sick bay where pupils are looked after by competent, qualified health practitioners. Four esidential full time qualified nurses are employed to be available 24/7 should any child fall sick. Also, a qualified doctor visits the school regularly. Referrals to Hospitals are made whenever required.













Frequently Asked Questions by Parents and our response

Here are some of the school policies, rules and regulations which we need to communicate to you now and which we hope will answer a lot of the frequently asked questions by new parents and students.

VISITING DAYS

Does the school have visiting days?

No. We do not have visiting days. Initially, we had visiting days but we had to cancel this when parents requested that we do so. Considering the nationwide catchment area of the school with parents having to travel huge distances on bad roads with all the attendant challenges, a consensus was reached that since the children come home every six weeks for half term and end of term, it is better to reduce the risks and that six weeks is not too long before they come home again. It is for this reason also that programmes that require parents to be in attendance in school are fixed for end of term or end of half-term so that parents can return with their children without having to come to the school exclusively for those programmes such as Inter-house Sports Days, Student Review Days, Prize-giving Days, Graduation Ceremonies

PROVISION

Does the school allow students to come to school with provision (food items)?

No. Ever since the school started, we have not allowed students to come to school with provision for three reasons:

- 1. The school feeds the children well and as such. there is no need to bring provision from home. Our students eat five times a day as follows: breakfast, mid-day snack (tuck shop - which is quite filling), lunch, dinner, night cap. Having snacks in the school ruins appetite, does not produce welladjusted children who eat good food placed before them and may breed students with poor attitude.
- 2. The school promotes equity. Traditionally, students become competitive about the kind of snacks/provision they bring into school in terms of costs and exclusiveness, which then leads to bullying, theft and other social and emotional
- 3. The school is located in an environment that is surrounded by bushes and having food in the hostel will certainly attract rodents from the surrounding bushes which then becomes a serious health hazard.

COMMUNICATION

Does the school allow students to carry mobile phones or tablets?

No. The school does not encourage students to carry their own mobile phones. Also, bringing gadgets into school such as laptops, ipads, tablets, electronic games devices etc. are not allowed. Parents are able to speak with their children at weekends through the telephone numbers provided by the school. Each house has two official telephone numbers through which the parents may speak with their children. Parents are not allowed to call the personal telephone numbers of the house parents. Also, the school has 24/7 internet connection. Therefore, parents and children are able to communicate via email.

HEALTH CARE

What are the health care arrangements in school and how do parents get to know if their ward is not

The school has a well-equipped and well staffed purpose-built health centre headed by a qualified matron who leads a team of five nurses who are resident in school with their own admin staff and store/dispensary keeper. The health bay has two wards - one for girls and one for boys where students who are unwell are kept and observed whilst undergoing treatment. Parents are informed early by the head of boarding if their wards become unwell and may need to be taken to the hospital in town to see the doctor. We have reputable private hospitals, that we refer students to following the matron's advice. The health centre in school only provides basic (primary) health care. Parents may also be asked to come and pick their children for medical attention where necessary e.g. for chicken pox or other infectious conditions.

UNIFORM RULES

What are the expectations regarding uniforms, use of jewellery, make-up and hairdo?

The school uniform consists of light blue shirt, dark grey trousers and skirt, navy jumper, navy blazer and the school's blue silver lined tie. Black school shoes (plain black shoes without laces for boys and Mary-Jane style school shoes for girls with a single strap across) to be worn with white socks and this is provided by parents. The house wear consists of light blue polo neck t-shirt, brown chino cargo shorts for boys and brown chino skirts for girls. Brown sandals and black socks is provided by parents. Besides the footwear, all uniform items are provided by the school. Parents are not to sew or purchase school uniforms but are required to purchase from the school. small, plain gold or silver studs are the only earrings allowed for girls. No makeup, nail varnish or paints are allowed. Girls are required to plait their hair in school (fortnightly) or cut their hair. Boys are not to wear any jewellery.

SUSPENSIONS & EXCLUSIONS

Does the school suspend or exclude students for poor behaviour?

The school reserves the right to suspend students from school as punishment for certain offences. Whilst this occurs rarely, it is the expectation of the school that the parents of the child who offends and is suspended from school for a certain period of time have the responsibility to come and collect the erring child and return him/her back to school after the expiration of the period of suspension.

TRANSPORTATION

Does the school organize transportation to and from the school to major cities in Nigeria?

Preston International School is blessed with highly effective Zonal P.T.A.s who organize transport arrangements to convey the students to and from school during holidays and resumption days. Lists of new parents with their contact details are forwarded to the leaders of the Zonal P.T.A.s who then make contact with the new parents to welcome them and introduce them to other members and intimate them with more details about the transportation arrangements.

RESUMPTION DAYS

Do new students resume before other students?

At the commencement of every academic session, all

students resume on the same day - new students as well as returning students. This is because quite a number of our students have siblings who are new students and having different resumption days will task parents to make two trips from very distant places. Upon resumption, the accounts department will need to issue clearance slips to students as full payment for the term is required before resumption. Once this is done, a very thorough check is done to ensure that students have all items on the boarding house list and that they are all labelled as instructed. Unlabelled items will be returned until they are labelled. Once this is okay, parents are to kiss their children good bye and hand them over to their house parents. We do not allow parents into the hostels on resumption days for security reasons as we are unable to tell who is who and also to facilitate the work being done by the house parents, wardens and prefects. Parents are allowed to arrange with the school office manager if they would like to visit the hostel during term time when there would not be many people in school. When going on holidays and when returning to school after the holidays, all students

are expected to be fully dressed in their school uniforms as good ambassadors of Preston International School. Students are NOT to return to school in their housewear.

EXEAT

Are students allowed out of school for special reasons?

Pupils are allowed out of school for special reasons when parents formally request in writing for them to be released from school for brief periods of time. Such reasons may include attending visa interviews, special tests and interviews, medical appointments and some family events. Each request is considered on its own merit. Once the school grants approval, an exeat slip is issued and is to be completed and submitted to the front office when the student returns to school. Parents should always ensure that they fix family holidays during school holidays as we are unable to release the students during term time. The calendar is usually available a year

BIRTHDAYS

How can I arrange for my child's birthday to be marked in school with his/her friends?

For the same purpose of ensuring equity in the school, parents are not allowed to bring in birthday cakes and food into school. Parents are encouraged to wait till the children come home for holidays so they can have their birthday parties at home. However, if parents will like their children to celebrate their birthdays in school, a modest cake and refreshments is purchased by the school and some of their friends come around to celebrate with them for a very reasonable cost of N10.000.

You were and are amazing people. Thank you for fostering the best educational experience for my children. You met all my expectations and more.


